Sexual Assault Prevention

The Sexual Assault Prevention Visioning Task Force shared its <u>final report</u> and recommendations. Task force co-chairs Dr. Jessica Sales (RSPH) and Associate Director for Prevention Strategies Jessica Hill (Office of Health Promotion) outlined recommendations. The Senate voted to create a Standing Committee for the Prevention of Sexual Violence, chaired by Dr. Sales, which will help consolidate campus prevention efforts and aid in ongoing assessments of both campus climate and program efficacy.

The Senate heard presentations from two new financial administrators, Vice President for Finance/Chief Financial Officer Carol Kissal and Emory's first Chief University Budget Officer Mike Andrechak.
